Midlands Korea Season which is led by Eastside Projects and New Art Exchange. The MKS

creates a platform for contemporary visual arts from Korea, with a focus on artists who

explore issues of migration, borders, and displacement.

Mixrice is a project team researching and suggesting alternative ways of producing art and

cultural activities. They have been involved in a series of activities such as media programs for

immigrated workers, video diaries, and channels.

The collective are bringing traces of their experiences working with refugee labourers in

Maseok Factory Complex, Seoul, to Birmingham, whilst continuing to build connections with

refugee and asylum seeker communities here. In doing so they look for the common ground

between these contexts – two different ideas of what freedom might look like.

The exhibition is part of Korea/UK 2017–18, a national celebration of British and Korean art

and culture funded by Arts Council England and Arts Council Korea and is co-produced with

the Korean Cultural Centre UK.
